





The book documents the Pioneers' 40-year competition between amateur and professional tennis, the eventual approval of Open Tennis in 1968 and the creation and development of the business, administration and governance of tennis as a professional Sport between 1968 and 1990. Written by Marshall Happer, who was the first and only "Commissioner" of men's professional tennis from 1981 to 1989, it documents the role of the International Tennis Federation in the development of men's professional tennis, the 16-year history of the Men's Tennis Council, the founding of the Association of Tennis Professionals in 1972 and its demise as a pure player association in 1990.


